Charles E. Edmiston, Jr., PhD, SM (ASCP), CIC

Dr. Charles E. Edmiston is the Emeritus Professor of Surgery, Director of Surgical Microbiology Research Laboratory, Department of Surgery at the Medical College of Wisconsin in Milwaukee and SSI State Champion for the Wisconsin Division of Public Health. He has served as a consultant to both CDC's HICPAC and the FDA, where he served as an expert on the infection control implications of implantable biomedical devices. He is a Fellow of SHEA, IDSA and APIC. He is Board credentialed in both Infection Control and as a Specialist in Clinical Microbiology. Dr Edmiston is a member of the Editorial Boards for Infection Control and Hospital Epidemiology, Surgery, and Surgical Infections and past member of the American Journal of Infection Control editorial board. He is the author of over 300 original peer reviewed manuscripts, book chapters, editorials, reviews, monographs.

Jennifer Lee, PharmD

Jennifer Lee is currently the Infectious Diseases Pharmacist Specialist at Scripps Mercy Chula Vista Hospital, and manages the Antimicrobial Stewardship Program (ASP) both locally and across the Scripps system. She received her PharmD from the University of Southern California, Los Angeles, and completed both General Acute Care and Infectious Disease residencies at Huntington Hospital in Pasadena. She has 15 years of experience in her field, and is proud to have established ASPs at both Kaiser and Scripps. Currently, she and her ID pharmacist counterparts throughout Scripps are working on publishing various stewardship interventions that highlight successful ASPs at non-teaching, community-based hospitals. Several of these publications focus on the implementation of a rapid diagnostic test for blood cultures.

Kim Delahanty, BSN, PHN, MBA/HCM, CIC, FAPIC

Kim Delahanty has been an infection preventionist in academic and private hospital systems for over 20 years and is currently the Administrative Director of Infection Prevention and Clinical Epidemiology at UCSD Health System.

She has been a leader in infection prevention in California. In her role as co-chair of a California Department of Public Health 2007-2012, healthcare associated working group and advisory committee, Delahanty helped draft a white paper described best practices in infection prevention for infection prevention programs in California. When California Senate Bill 739 and later 1058, and Senate Bill 158 were introduced and became law, Kim as chair of the committee acted as a strong advocate for patient and a clear strong voice for the infection preventionist. This experience working on the committee demonstrated and enhanced her ability to work with diverse groups and fully understand the implications of regulatory language on infection prevention programs. It was because of this strong work she was a recipient of APIC's 2012 Hero in Infection Prevention award.

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Kim is a tireless advocate for education of the infection preventionist, as witnessed by her role as the co-chair of the CACC Foundations/Advanced training program. as faculty for the APIC Ambulatory Surgery Center (ASC) Infection Prevention

Course, EPI 101 and the national CIC review course. She has worked internationally, most recently, establishing an outreach program for Japanese infection preventionists. She also coauthored an Oncology chapter in the recent APIC text as well as many peer review journals on infection prevention.

As a San Diego and Imperial County APIC chapter member she has held the offices of membership chair, president elect, president and past president. Ms. Delahanty serves as a member of the California APIC Coordinating Council and has held officer positions of president-elect, president and past president.

She has served on the APIC Practice Guidance Committee. She serves as an APIC liaison for the HRET/AHRQ ASC Surgical Site Infection Prevention project. National APIC board member 2015-2018. She is a Fellow of APIC.

Ms. Delahanty received her Bachelors of Science degree in Nursing at the University of Phoenix and her dual Masters degrees in Business Administration and Healthcare Management at the University of Phoenix. She has been certified in infection prevention since 2003.
